February Principal's Message:

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Setting Goals, Sharing Learning, Working Together

It is difficult to believe that we are over halfway through the school year. February and March mark the time when we share student progress, growth and achievements through our report cards in February and our parent teacher interviews in March. This process is very detailed and looks a little different in each classroom; however, there are some common practices that we all share:

Assessment FOR Learning: Teachers spend the majority of their time engaging students in this process. Assessment for Learning is the ongoing practice of:

- Helping children understand what it is they are going to be learning. Teachers take the Alberta Education Outcomes and put them into language that we can all understand... for example..."Understand stories read" (gr.1) or "Solve math problems using a variety of strategies" (gr. 4)
- Coaching students in their learning
- Helping students set goals
- Giving feedback to your child
- Allowing your child to learn from his/her mistakes
- Creating opportunities to practice and improve
- Talking to your child about the next steps in learning
- Adapting teaching to meet the learning needs of students
- Revising student goals as they move forward in their learning



Assessment **OF** Learning: When teachers pause in the learning process to share your child's progress, this is called Assessment of Learning. Teachers use the following to identify where your child is performing:

- Products: These are the samples of student work and assessments that show you what your child is working on and what they have learned;
- Observations: Teachers observe your child each day in all of the different tasks and activities they are involved in; and
- Conversations: Teachers listen and ask guiding questions to help your child share what they know and are able to do.
- Parent/Teacher Conferences: This is the time when we invite you in to formally share the work your child has been involved in and your child's progress. Teachers provide you with an opportunity to ask questions and share feedback. Our parent/teacher conferences will be on March 18th and 19th.

We would like to thank all of you for your support and look forward to seeing you at our Parent/Teacher Conferences on March 18th and March 19th. Report cards will be sent home with students on February 7th:D

9 Square In The Air - It's a really cool Volleyball Game!

Students enjoyed two weeks learning how to play "traditional" Volleyball and as a special thrill they got to experience the 9 Square Volleyball Game! 9 Square is an exciting and fun new game that we were able to purchase last year with the help of our fabulous Parent Council. Students learned how to keep the "Ball In The Air" using beginner techniques of Volleyball hitting. The game can be played with 9 - 29 players all trying to find a way to eliminate other players from their squares in order to move closer to the coveted "middle square". It's great fun! We were able to modify the game for each grade group to have success.

The 9 Square Game also GLOWS IN THE DARK (with Black Lights) which was a total hit with the kids!

Students also learned the traditional game of Volleyball on two other courts that were set up to provide students a Volleyball experience at either Level 1 Skills or Level 2 Skills. Scoring by using the same official rules of Volleyball with the modifications that students could "catch" the ball and "throw" it if a hit and pass was not possible in the rally. This is a proper way to build appropriate skills and game sense for success. The rallys were exciting and the students really got into wanting their team to win the game (score to 10 wins). The Grade 1 students especially embraced the Volleyball games at Level 1 and had some very intense battles!

The grade 1 and Kinder students will also continue doing our Fitness Warm-up with a Video Follow-Along routine. Even though the paddles with bean bags and balls are fun to learn, it is quite challenging so we will mix in a bit of other stuff to keep it light. The old saying; "You have to start somewhere" rings true as most of the little ones have never seen a racket or held a paddle before. It is always awesome to see the look of JOY on a student's face when they figure out a new skill!! Maybe I'll have the next Family Ping Pong Champion or Pickle Ball Pro ready for the summer holidays!





Paddles and Rackets

Using a paddle for the first time can be quite challenging and exciting. Whenever I teach skills to students I break it down into 3 Levels as a minimum. Starting at level 1 we learn what types of sports require "rackets" or "paddles", we learn the paddle parts, how to hold the racket properly, make a basic stroke, and learn how to balance a bean bag or a ball on the paddle. We also learn which hand feels the best to hold the paddle in. Level 2 challenges will introduce a variety of balls that can be used with the racket to sustain a ball bounce or tapping rhythm by the student. This requires focus, concentration, and coordination. For younger students we use bean bags to "flip" before the ball can be introduced. Passing a bean bag back and forth with a friend is another skill we will try to master. For Level 3 we will learn how to start a rally against the wall by ourselves and keep it going. If students can master Level 3 only then will they be able to start hitting back and forth across a net. It's all about progressions.

Mrs. Sampson has purchased for the school a couple of Pickleball nets, some paddles, and balls to give students an opportunity to start learning Pickleball! This is going to be Awesome! We definitely have a lot of exciting sports opportunities to pack into February!

Grade 4 Floor Hockey League

I have organised The grade 4 Annual Floor Hockey Lunch League again. Games will begin this month on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. There are 5 Boys Teams that I will referee and monitor and 3 Girls-Open Teams that Mr.J will referee. The Floor Hockey League is one of those special traditions at OES that students wait to get to grade 4 to finally play. It is a competitive league. I believe competition is healthy for kids as they learn to navigate the ups and downs of their floor hockey game results and win or lose together. As one Boy said to me a couple of years ago; "I've waited my whole life for this!" There will be a legitimate Play Off Round to decide the Grand Champion and then the Classic Teachers Versus Students Battle!

Grade 4 Swimming Lessons

Heads Up! The grade 4 students will begin their swimming lessons in February. The lessons are held at The Olds Aquatic Center. Please contact your child's teacher or the Aquatic Center if you have any questions. Swimming is a life skill and I encourage parents to check out the vast array of swimming opportunities available to us in Olds. Grade 3 students will do their swimming lessons starting in March so there is plenty of time to dig out those swim progress reports which will be requested by the pool. Thank You to Mrs. Hallett who spends a great deal of time meticulously scheduling bus transportation and schedules for teachers.

Shoe check for all students.

Please help me out by checking your child's indoor shoes regularly. Students should not be wearing boots, slippers, or crocs for safety reasons. I also spend a large part of my day teaching students how to wear their shoes properly by putting their whole foot in the shoe instead of smashing the heel flat and using it as a slip on and by tying laces. If you have your child in shoes with laces then please ensure you have taught them how to tie their laces.






